

ON THE STREETS.

The Summer's Work on the Streets Laid Out by the Special Committee in Charge.

The special committee appointed to decide what work shall be done on the streets this season and when and where it shall be done met at city hall on Wednesday afternoon, all the members being present. Ald. Farrell was also present part of the time and Road Master McKay looked in for a little while.

After a lengthy session the following schedule was agreed upon: The work to be done in the order given and to be commenced at once:

Queen street to be thoroughly repaired and made as smooth as possible from the Court House to Smythe street.

King street to be gone over from Regent street to Smythe street, the holes to be filled up and the crossings repaired.

Government Lane from Smythe street to the Hermitage to be smoothed, graded and made as passable as possible.

Brunswick street to receive attention and repairs on the blocks between Northumberland and Smythe streets, between York and Westmorland streets and between Regent and Carleton streets.

Regent street from the wharf to Brunswick street to be cleaned, the holes filled up, the street made smooth and the gutters cleaned out.

Carleton street to be gone over and repaired between Queen street and the bridge and between George and Charlotte streets.

York street from Queen to Charlotte street to be thoroughly repaired and smoothed.

Westmorland street to be smoothed from King street to Saunders street, with special attention to the crossings.

Needham and Saunders streets to be gone over and repaired wherever required.

Sunbury street requires a lot of work and is to be repaired and put in first class condition from the Canada Eastern railway to the foot of College hill. The road machine to be used for grading the street and deepening the gutters.

The extension of Waterloo from the Gregory bridge to Morrison's mill to be built anew. The street to be turned up with the road plough and covered with gravel to a depth sufficient to make a good and permanent highway and to be thoroughly rolled.

Although the committee made no arrangement for completing the work of macadamizing York Street, which was begun several days ago and would take four or five days longer to complete, it is generally understood that when the above schedule is completed that then York Street will be finished.

In addition to the above the Road Master has been given instructions to have the principal streets swept and cleaned frequently, as often as is necessary to keep them looking well.

LIGHTNING'S HAVOC.

Chicago's Fire Marshal Has an Experience With the Electrical Force.

CHICAGO, June 13.—During a storm last night the residence of Fire Marshal Driscoll in South Chicago was shattered by lightning just as the Marshal was preparing to answer a call with the department to another residence which had been set on fire by the lightning. The Marshal was stunned and left unconscious by the stroke. His wife quickly revived him by sprinkling water on his face, but while she was thus engaged the fire cut off the exits in front and the Marshal upon regaining consciousness had to carry his wife, her mother and his children to a place of safety. Then he directed the department in his work both upon his own residence and the neighboring house with the first truck.

A number of other buildings were struck by lightning throughout the city and suburbs and much damage was done by wind and water.


