ZEPPELIN CARRIED

SIX MACHINE GUNS

Form of Vessel Changed from Those Used Earlier in War.

London, March 27.—The Times publishes today a lengthy account by the French aviation expert, Georges Prade, of the results of his study of the remains of a Zeppelin brought down Feb. 21 at Ravigny. M. Prade believes the airehip was of the latest type and compares its details with those of the Z-8 which was brought to set in surface in August, 1914. The warter says:
