Wider Charges That Doctor Had Designs on Others.

THE WOMAN IN CASE HEARD

The Dentist Wrote Letters About the Peck Estate.

New York, March 27.—From state papers, Asst. Dist. Atty. John T. Dooley declared tonight that the authorities had to believe Dr. Arthur Warren Waite, accused of poisoning his wealthy father-in-law, John E. Peck, of Grand Rapids, Mich., had designs on the lives of at least four persons. Mrs. Horton, according to Mr. Dooley, admitted that she shared a "studio" with Waite at a hotel here, and that Waite registered with her as "Dr. and Mrs. A. W. Walters."

Mrs. Horton, who was subjected to all-day examination, was said by Mr. Dooley to have stated that she believed Waite planned to kill her and her husband. "Mrs. Horton," continued Mr. Dooley, "has reason to believe, according to her statement, that Waite was trying to persuade her to take some kind of medicine."

Mr. Dooley added that Mrs. Horton was with Waite when he made purchases "the nature of which cannot now be divulged." Mrs. Horton also told him, he said, that Waite believed her to be wealthy, and had questioned her regarding the extent of her finances.

Mrs. Horton was accompanied to the district attorney's office by her husband. Waite Shows Improvement. Dr. Waite showed a steady improvement physically today at Bellevue. When he was taken there Friday

Wider Charges That Doctor Had Designs on Others.

NOW BELIEVES HUSBAND GUILTY

Was at First Too Shocked to Believe Horrible Charges.

Grand Rapids, March 27.—Mrs. Arthur W. Waite, wife of the New York dentist, who has been charged with the murder of her father and mother, today issued the formal signed statement: "I feel it my duty to the public to make the following statement. No previous statement said to have been made by me is authentic. I have given nothing whatever to the press."

"When I was informed of the serious charges against my husband I was so shocked and amazed I could not believe them true. It seemed to me impossible that a man who had been so uniformly gentle and kind to me and apparently so loyal could be guilty of the crime with which he is charged."

"My faith in him began to be shaken when it was practically proved to me that Dr. Waite was living with another woman in the Plaza Hotel. "As the evidence against him increased from day to day, I was compelled, against my will and my deepest affection for him, to accept the evidence."

"Of course I cannot and will not say he is guilty, but it certainly looks as if that is the fact. "As far as I am concerned I must and will permit the law to take its course. I will stand aside and leave the whole matter to those who have the case in charge."

"I have told all I know, frankly and fully, to the authorities and will not discuss that statement which is in their hands to view as they see fit. "It is all very sad and very terrible. All I ask is that I may be left alone with my friends to bear my sorrow the best I can. —Clara Peck Waite."

Search Waite Home. A most thorough search was made early this morning of the Waite apartment in the Colosseum. One of the first things found was a safe, hid behind a painting. This was filled with silverware that seemed to have been given the young people at their marriage Sept. 9 last.

In the wardrobe in Dr. Waite's bedroom were found more than 100 garments, while in Mrs. Waite's wardrobe were found nearly 50 gowns. Two detectives remained on guard in the apartment.

Dr. Otto H. Schultz, the district attorney's pathologist, returned from Grand Rapids today. Informed that Waite had purchased 90 grains of arsenic on March 2, he said virtually the same amount had been found in the organs of Mr. Peck's body at the autopsy. Deputy Asst. Dist. Atty. Francis X. Mancuso, who went West with Dr. Schultz, was ordered to return Sunday and to bring with him Percy Peck, a son of the dead druggist.
