Representatives at Washington, on the 27th ult.

Now, how is it that the rulers of Ireland cannot pro-
vide bread and work for all? In a land so teeming
with fertility, so rich in natural resources as Her Brit-
annic Majesty's "Kingdom of Ireland?" Let them give
Irish capital and Irish enterprise fair play and reason-
able protection, and see that the relations between
Irish landlord and tenant are placed on a proper basis; let
them encourage the efforts of encouraging Irish manufactures
and developing Irish resources, and they will find it
no answer the purpose of tranquillizing Ireland better than
any of the restrictive measures they can enact, or all the
military strength they can bring to bear against that un-
happy country. Add to this the abolition of that un-
happy and anomalous, the Irish Church Establishment. Let
them, in fine, treat Ireland as a child rather than a step-
child, and they will see whether her chronic diseases of
famine and rebellion will resist such a course of wise
and beneficent legislation.
