

## PRIVY COUNCIL SUSTAINS APPEAL

The Judicial Committee of the Privy Council has upset the judgenent of an Ontario Court which awarded damages to a man who was injured while riding without author ity on a railway train. The Privy Council held that while a railway by its sale of a ticket contracted to safely carry the holder, it had no contract with a man who had no ticket, and was in fact a tresspasser, who might have been prosecuted for his act. The case in point happened on a

rain which was backing from one Station at London. Untario to another in a different part of the City and on which a tresspasser jumped on the rear platform to steal a ride between the two stations. There was a collision and the man was seriously injured, resulting in a suit against one of the railways. The Trial Judge and Jury acquitced the railway. The Higher Court reversed this judgement and the rallway appealed. The Court of Appeals in Ontario sustained the Higher Court, after which it was taken to the Privy Council, and the Lords of the Judicial Committee reversed all the judgement but the Trial Judge. The defendant had to pay the costs in all the appeals,


