

Niagara Falls, Ont., March 22.—Officials of the Canadian and American Express Companies are in the city investigating the big robbery of one of their express cars either in the G. T. R. yards here or at some point between here and New York. The car, which contained valuable furs, silks, etc., said to total two hundred thousand in value, was looted and many valuable silks, etc., stolen. The car was found with door open in the yards here. The total loss cannot be ascertained till the goods are checked up, but the robbers overlooked one small package of furs valued at forty thousand dollars. This goods were for Toronto.

WILL AID SOLDIERS

British Government to Pay Passage to Canada to Those who Wish to Emigrate. London, March 22.—The Canadian Associated Press understands that an agreement has been reached for the promotion of an Imperial scheme of immigration to enable British soldiers to settle in the Dominions. The basis of the plan is free passage provided by the British Government and loans at pre-war interest to the Dominion Governments acting as agents for the British Government. The idea is to open up new tracts, build railways and generally finance settlers. Legislative effect will be given to the scheme, which is independent of the plans of the Dominion for their soldiers.

EIGHTY-FIVE HUNDRED MEN NEARING HALIFAX

Halifax, March 21.—A wireless message from the Steamship Olympic states she will be off Chebuco Head at four o'clock Sunday afternoon and dock an hour later. The Olympic is believed to be off the harbour but no word has been received from her this morning. The Royal George is now due but has not been sighted yet. These three boats are bringing a total of eighty-five hundred Canadian war veterans.

BRITISHERS LEASE GROUND

Big Tract of a Land Near St. John, N. B., Secured for Trans-Atlantic Flight Attempt. St. Johns Nfld., March 22.—Two British airmen, Morgan and Fenn, have leased ground in the vicinity of St. John's for the purpose of attempting a trans-Atlantic flight. Morgan has returned to England to bring out his machine. Fenn represents Hawker, who is now on his way here and will fly a Sopwith machine.

CAPITAL AND LABOR

The Montreal Gazette has grave fears about the safety of Hon. Mackenzie King's proposal to give labor a share in the control of industry. It looks through its glasses twice at the subject matter of his address and soberly says: "To grant the laborer control over capital, jointly or otherwise, is to give him practical possession of the property of another, and if control means anything, he is enabled to direct the use of such property to his own advantage without risk to himself or responsibility to others. Labor has shown itself lately to be possessed of predatory instincts. The demands of labor have become more and more burdensome, and what has occurred under existing conditions is sufficient evidence of the use to which labor would put its share in the control of capital. If Mr. King is seeking to frighten capital out of industry he is going the right way, about it." If Mr. King proposed to grant the laborer control over capital we, too, disagree. But we don't think that is what he said, or intended. What he believes is that labor should more and more be given a "conscious interest in the life of the nation." There is a proper relation which must be observed between the man who is employing and the man who is employed, but that should be accompanied by a sense on the part of both, that one cannot get along without the other. The best results are found to be obtained from industries where the workman is made to feel that he is an integral part of the industry, that his labor is an honorable and appreciated thing and that his moral and physical welfare and that of his family, if he has one, are worth protection and courteous consideration. Sound business today recognizes that efficiency to the highest degree is obtained from the men who are getting on well and who are made to feel an interest in the concern for which they work.

A LOSS TO THE PROVINCE

In the death of Hon. W. P. James, the Province of Ontario has sustained a loss. He was a man of unusual ability and strength of character. Though differing from him and his party on many things, we still must recognize that as a man the late Minister was one of the most capable figures in the Legislature during his service there. His interest in things humanitarian was broad and sincere. He took a great interest in the establishment of the prison farm at Guelph as a means of giving better chance to those who err in life and must pay the penalty of serving terms for their offences. In constructive policy and debate the late Minister was also an outstanding figure and friend and foe will join in expressing regret that he has been taken away at such an early period of his career.
