S., shortly after midnight, struck some submerged rocks, which injured her so badly that she sank four hours afterwards. Her officers and crew, consisting of twenty-two men, were rescued in safety.

The captain, who was ill with jaundice, and went under treatment at the advice of his physician, died in the city.
