Mr. Ford will begin his work or behalf of the government Thursday morning at the Brooklyn Navy Yard where he will make a descent in a submarine by arrangements perfected for him to-day by Secretary of the Navy Daniels. In addition to his efforts to adopt gasoline as a motive power for the undersea boats, Mr Ford, it was stated to-day, has developed a scheme by which aeroplanes without passengers may be directed and used by wireless as practically self acting engines of war.
