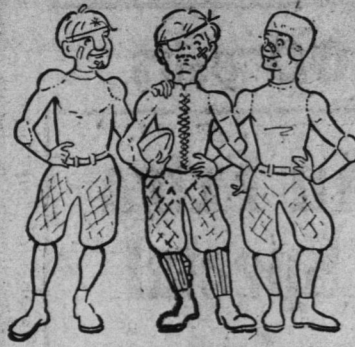


Three Schoolboys Dresses!

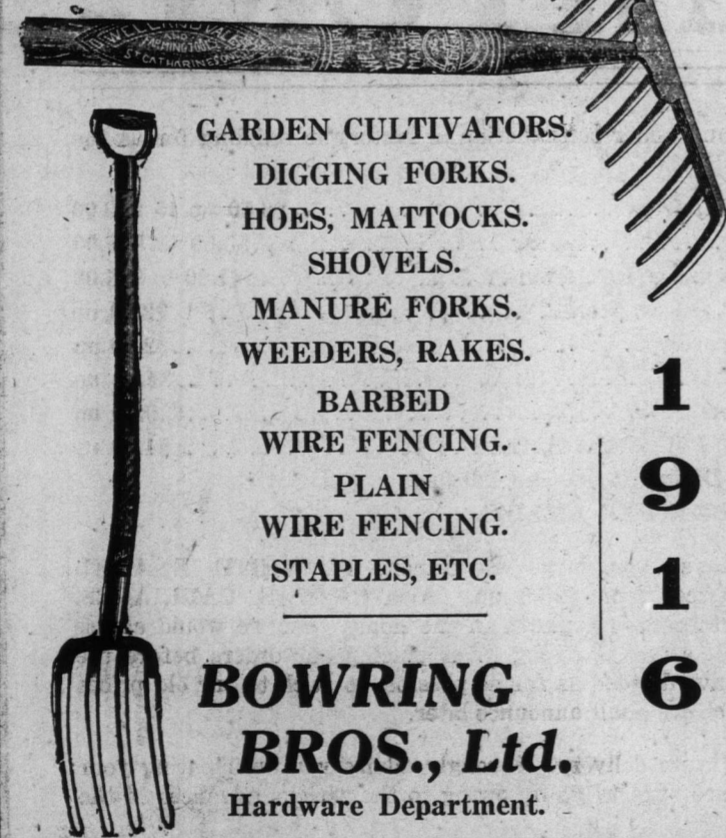
