

PREMIER THINKS LAKE OF WOODS DISPUTE SOLVED

Members of Dominion Cabinet and Representatives of Provinces Convene.

PRESENTS NO DETAILS

Ottawa, Nov. 15.—An agreement which it is believed will prove satisfactory to the interested parties with respect to control of the levels of the Lake of the Woods was reached at today's conference between members of the Dominion cabinet and representatives of the provinces and other interests concerned. While no details of the proposed agreement were given out tonight, it was stated by the prime minister at the close of today's conference that the Lake of the Woods problem was considered to be amicably arranged, while the settlement of the question of Rainy Lake levels hinged upon whether or not the data presented today was found to cover all the information required. There still remains to be decided, it is understood, whether the Lake of the Woods treaty between United States and Canada can be enlarged or whether it will be necessary to submit the question of upper waters to the international joint commission for settlement.

The details of the plan, which it is understood, he laid before the cabinet at its meeting here tomorrow, and the provincial premiers who participated in today's conference will also place its decision before their colleagues before the matter is made public.

BRITAIN PAYS PART OF WAR DEBT TO U. S.

Treasury of Reserve Bank Reports Receipts of \$50,610,000.

Washington, Nov. 15.—Receipts of \$50,610,000 for the account of the United States government was reported today to the treasury by the Federal Reserve Bank of New York. Of the total, \$50,000,000 represents interest on the war debt of Great Britain to the United States, and \$610,000 represents interest on the debt representing the sale of silver to Great Britain during the war which is in the process of liquidation, there being \$61,000,000 of this account still outstanding.

A similar payment of \$50,000,000 on October 15 by Great Britain makes a total of \$100,000,000 paid as the first semi-annual installment of interest on the war debt of nearly \$500,000,000, but the two payments are subject to adjustment as the debt at present bears interest at 5 per cent, while the debt funding act authorizes a rate of not less than 4 1/2 per cent.

NATIONALISTS LEAD IN ELECTION IN POLAND

Warsaw, Nov. 15.—Unofficial returns from Sunday's elections for the Polish Senate, available today, indicate that 22 nationalist, 22 radical, 25 non-political and 2 independent senators were elected.

BELIEVES WIFE OF MINISTER SLAYER

Wilbur A. Mott Will Attempt To Implicate Mrs. Hall.

New Brunswick, N. J., Nov. 15.—How Wilbur A. Mott will attempt to implicate Mrs. Frances Stevens Hall in the slaying of her husband, the Rev. Edward Wheeler Hall, and his choir member, Mrs. Eleanor Reinhardt Mills, was outlined today. Summarized, the state will attempt to prove that:

Mrs. Hall knew of the relations between her husband and Mrs. Mills. That Mrs. Hall left her home about 8 o'clock on the night on which the crime was committed, running hurriedly to the home of a cousin, Henry Carpenter next door.

That Mrs. Hall was the woman in gray mentioned by Mrs. Jane Gibson. Five subpoenas have been issued for witnesses at the first grand jury session next Monday. After Monday the program of the state was not outlined, but Mr. Mott declared it possible that the state might call as a witness Mrs. Nellie Russell, negress, whose affidavit was presented to refute Mrs. Gibson's story, "to let the jury draw its own conclusions." Mr. Mott declared he placed no faith in Mrs. Russell's affidavit.

Subpoenas have been issued for Raymond Schneider and Pearl Bahner, who found the bodies of the minister and choir singer; Mrs. Edward Stryker, whose telephone Schneider used to notify the police, and Edward Carrigan and James Curran, policemen, first on the scene of the crime.

Mr. Mott's program calls for refutation of several of the statements made by Mrs. Hall—one that she did not leave her home early that evening and another that she did not know of the relations of Mr. Hall and Mrs. Mills. Timothy N. Pfeiffer, attorney for Mrs. Hall, declared that the new evidence, purporting to show Mrs. Hall went to the Carpenter home was unimportant because "the authorities know that Henry Carpenter and his wife were not at home that night." Mr. Mott said the presentation of testimony would take "three, four or five days."

CREW OF ORVIETO RETURNS TO WORK

Melbourne, Australia, Nov. 15.—(Canadian Press Cable, via Reuters Agency).—The crew of the steamer Orvioto, who went on strike a few days ago, are gradually returning to their ship, 162 having gone back yesterday and 45 today. It is thought the remainder will return tomorrow, the men having received guarantees that they will not be penalized after their arrival in England.

At Sydney 80,000 tons of shipping is laid up, owing to the commercial depression and to Japanese-American competition. At Auckland, New Zealand, 60 vessels, aggregating 84,000 tons of shipping, are idle, and probably the number of unemployed among the waterside workers will reach 1,000 by the end of the week. In consequence of the coastal strike the New Zealand employers are beginning to man their ships with free labor.

PROCLAIM MARTIAL LAW AT JUDENBURG IN STYRIA

Vienna, Nov. 15.—Martial law has been proclaimed at Judenburg, in Styria, where military and police, reinforced by students, hold the city and bridgehead, hills across the River Mur 2,000 workmen face them, threateningly.

These armed workmen, angered by repeated parades of the newly-organized Heimwehr, began raiding the homes of peasant members of the organization and confiscating their arms. Several members of the attacking parties were arrested and the workmen assembled when the authorities declined to release them. The situation is aggravated by the increasing unemployment, due to the closing of factories and the coal mines or the shortening of hours of work.

CANADA'S TRADE SHOWS INCREASE DURING MONTH

Ottawa, Nov. 15.—(By Canadian Press).—Canada's total trade during October showed an increase of approximately \$30,000,000, as compared with the grand total for October, 1921, according to the summary issued tonight by the department of customs and excise.

For the seven months ending Oct. 31, this year, the total was \$68,000,000 higher than during the corresponding seven months of last year. Exports of domestic produce were chiefly responsible for the increase.

LINER PITTSBURG RESCUES CREW OF MONTE GRAPPA

Boston, Nov. 15.—The crew of the steamer Monte Grappa has been taken on board the liner Pittsburgh, and the Grappa, listing to port so that the deck was level with the sea, was abandoned in mid-Atlantic, according to a wireless message received here shortly after noon today. The rescue of the Grappa's crew was accomplished some time last night, the message indicated.
