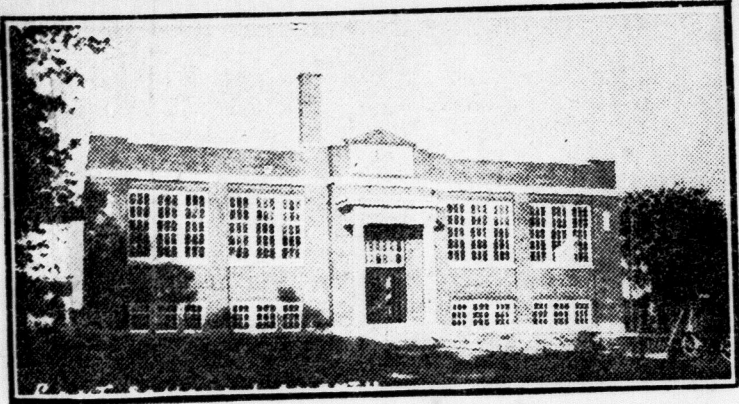
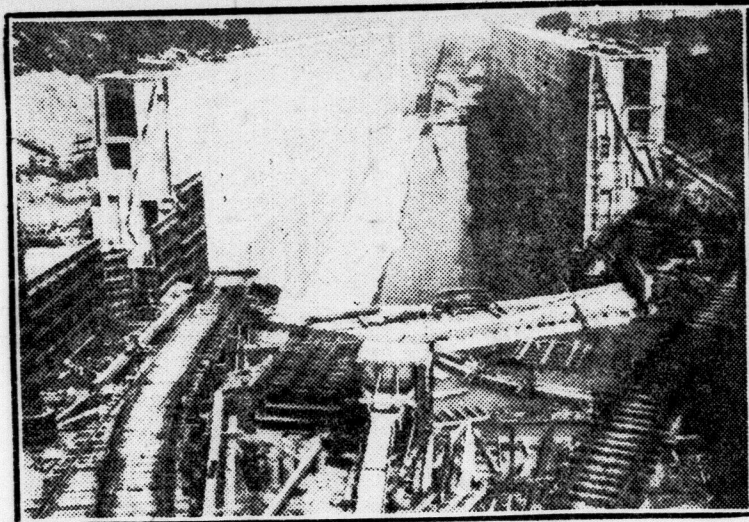

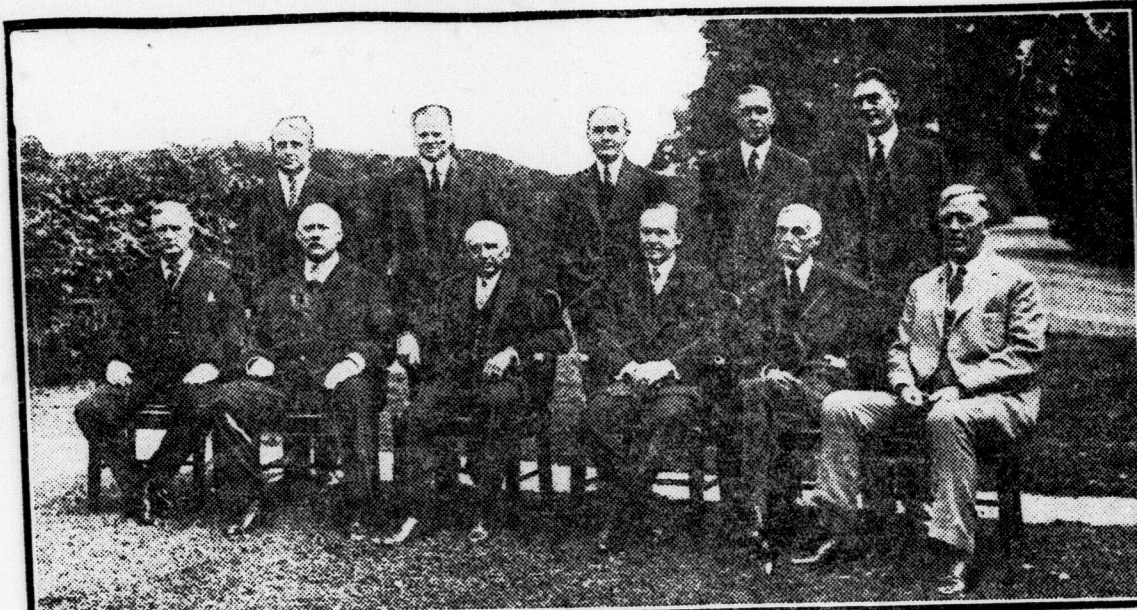
Master James Waring, youthful farmer of Sombra township. James' greatest delight is to drive his father's horses, and he is an apt scholar.

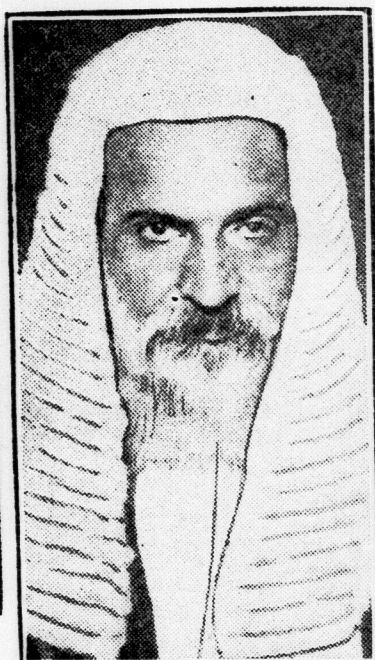

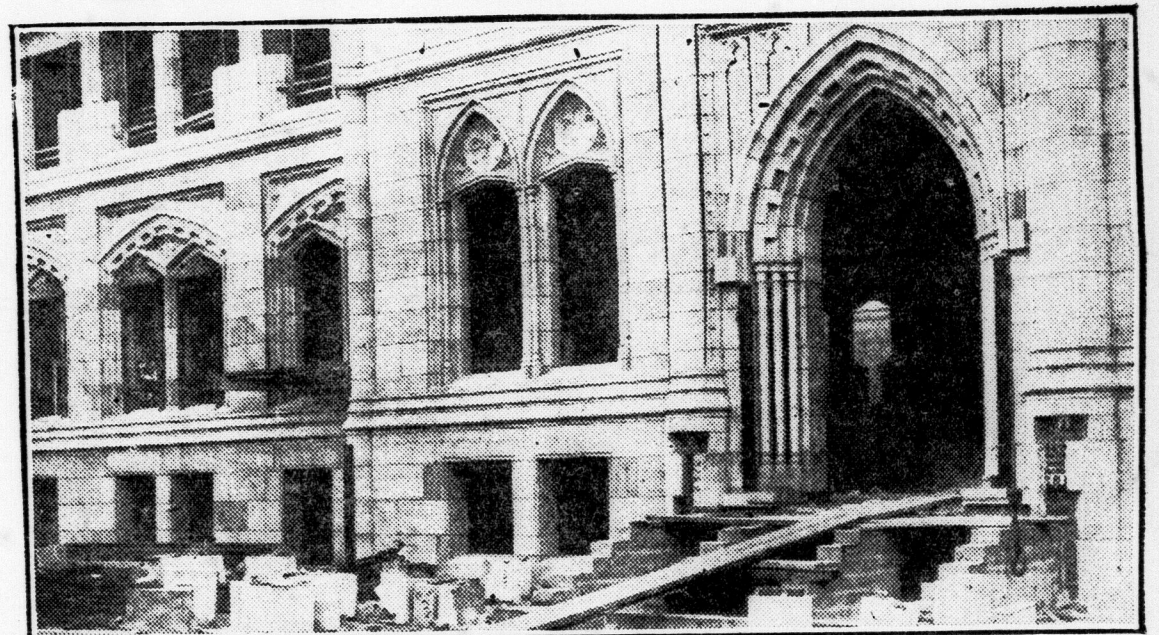

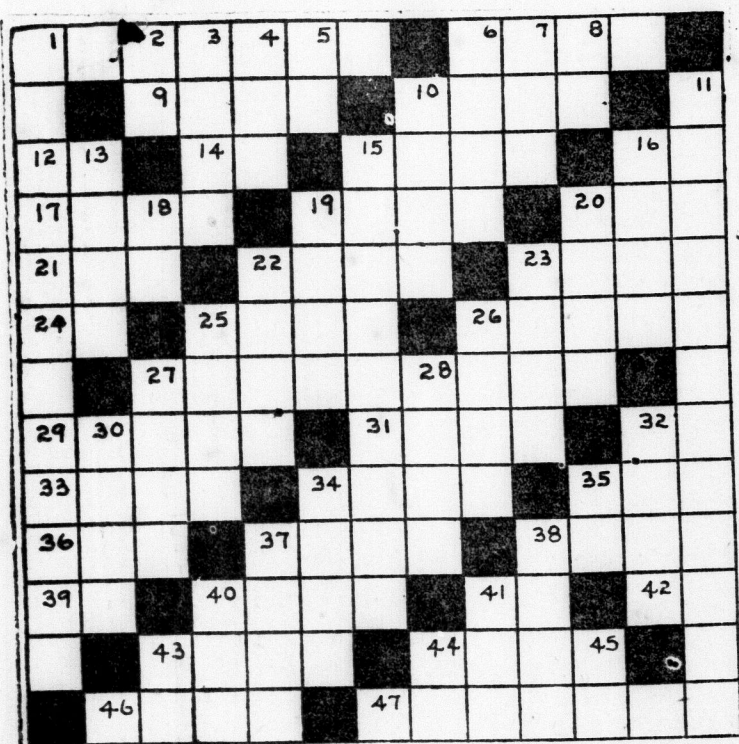
