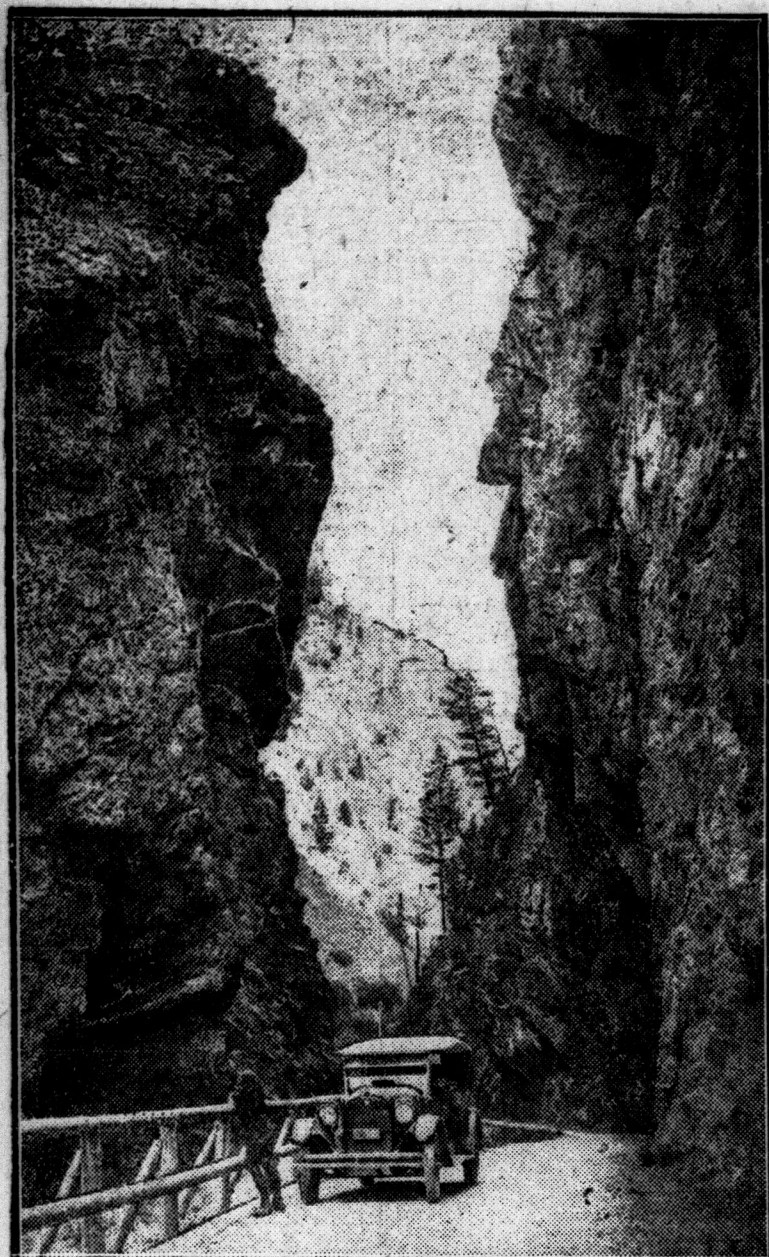


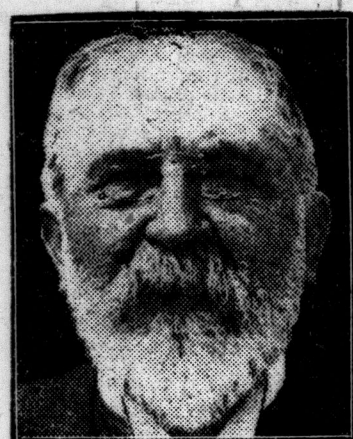

Senator Gaston Menier, member of the French Senate, is on this continent with his family on a business and pleasure trip.



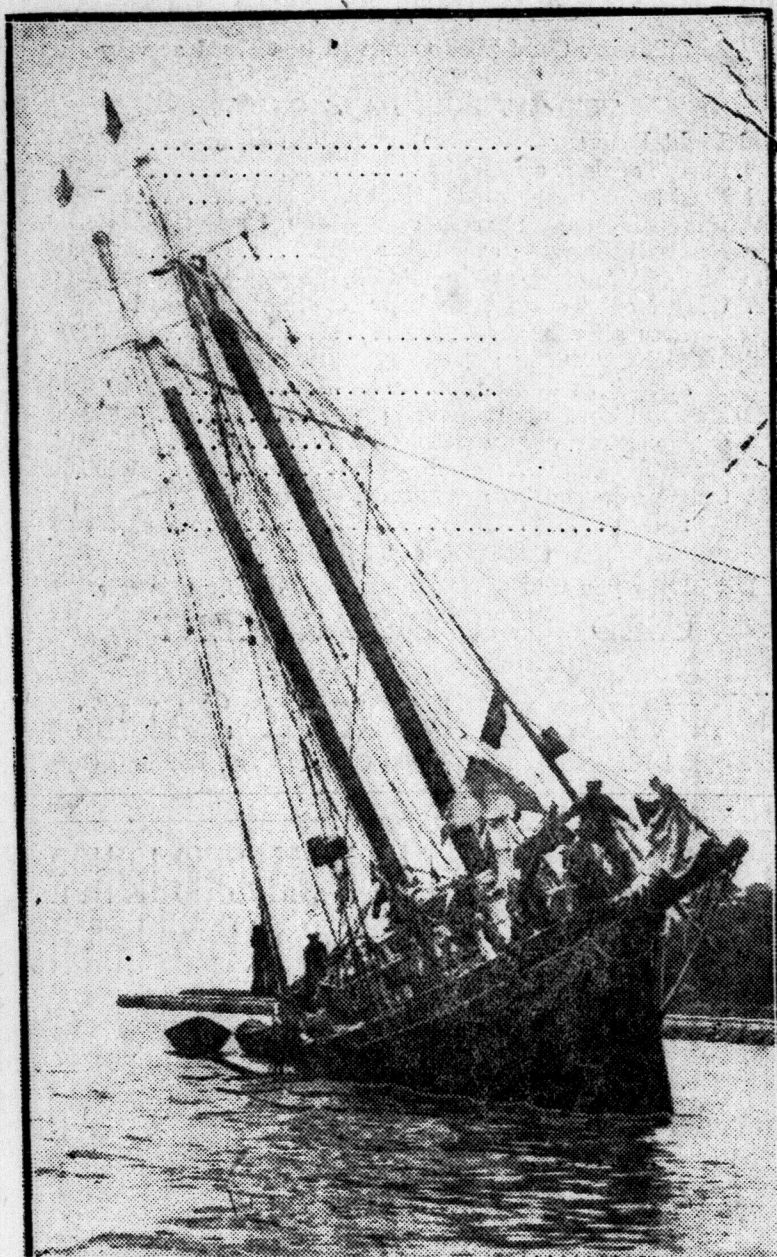

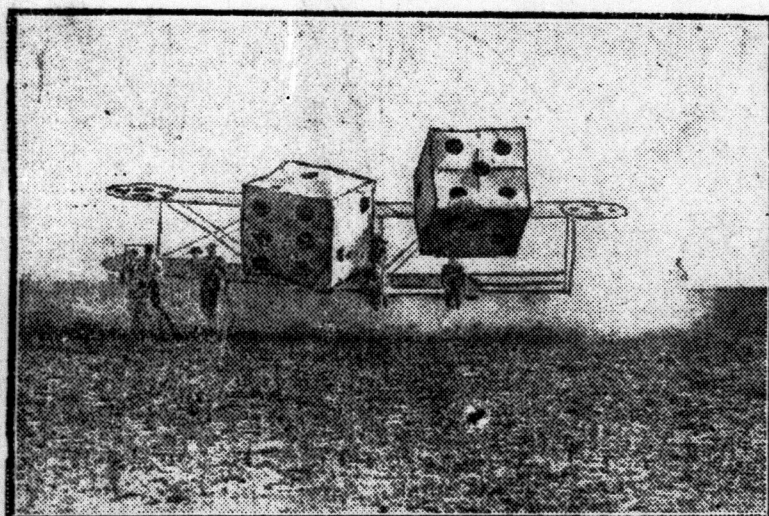
A new portrait of Miss E. McKane, England's champion woman tennis player, who met defeat in the Wimbledon finals.

Aviators show the latest manner of sporting the numerical cubes. The propeller blows the dice across the field, then the fliers follow and read the good or bad news.



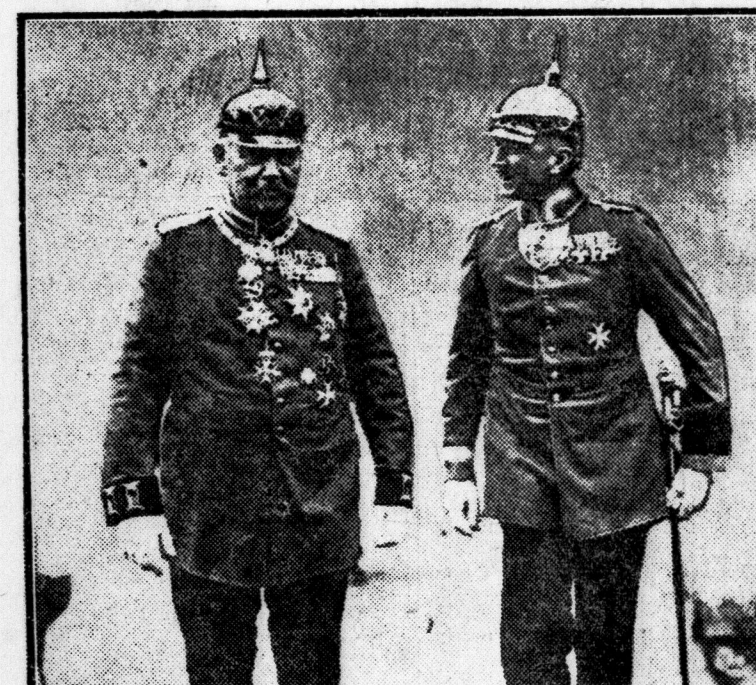
Bert Albright has won the distinction of being the best blower of a coaching horn at the recent horse show held at Olympia, London.



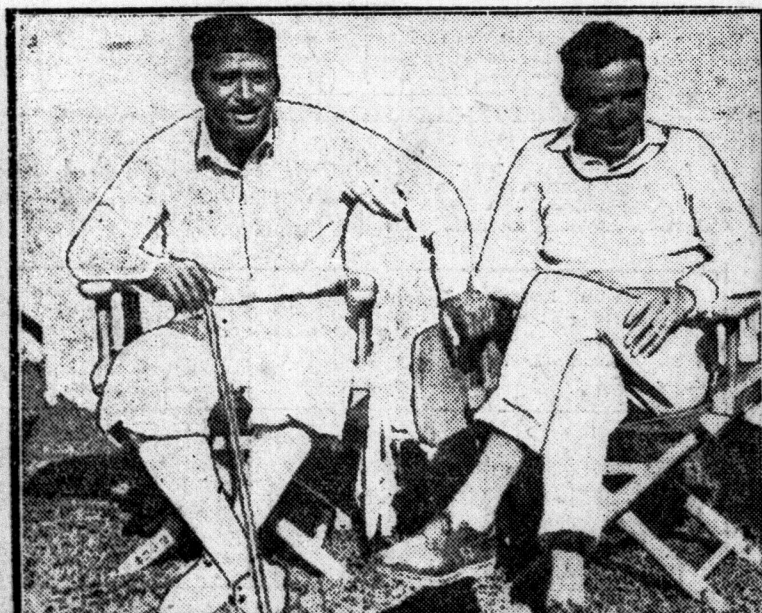

The subject of this classic pose is Kathleen Norgate, a fair bather, who is not afraid to take dives from considerable altitudes.



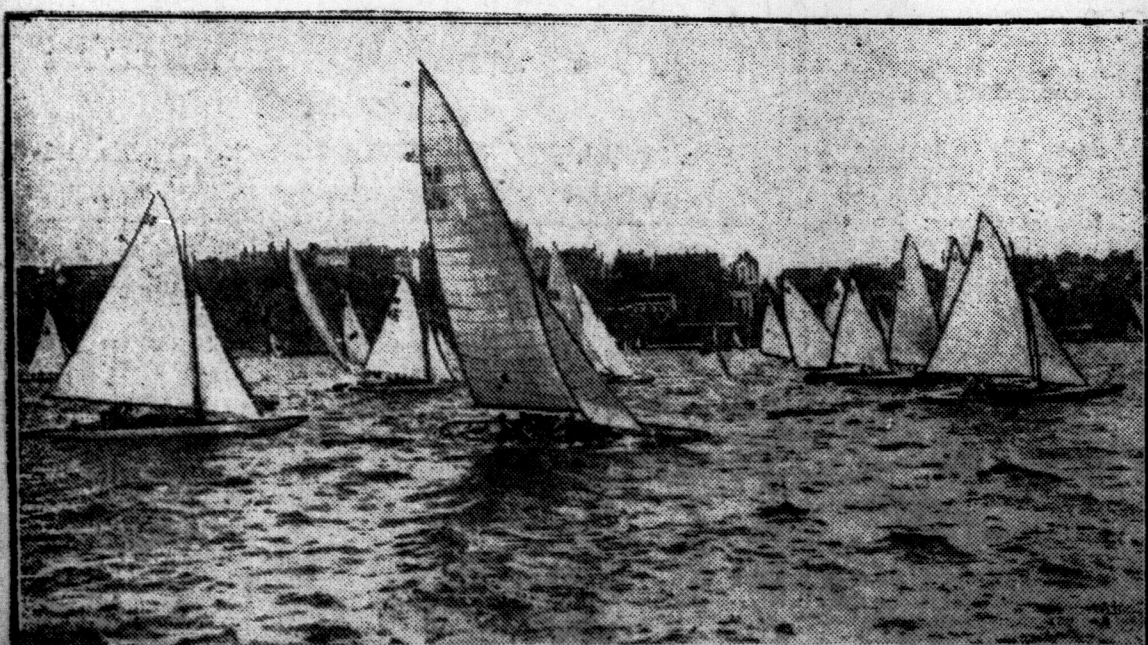
Germany's war lord, General Von Hindenburg, still retains the pomp of former days. He is seen leaving the field after a review of the military police.
