LIQUOR LAW CHANGES.

In his annual report Rev. W. D. Wilson, chief inspector under the liquor act, recommends changes for effective dealing with extracts, etc.; limitation of quantity that may be prescribed; for a wholesale government dispensary to guarantee quality and fair prices. The inspector's staff took 574 perquisitions. There were 498 convictions and seventy-six dismissals. Eleven appeals were taken by defendants to the supreme court. Nine cases are still to be heard; two resulted in reduction of fines.

Notice is hereby given that application will be made by the Town of Campbellton to the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick at the next session thereof for the passing of an Act.

To authorize the Town Council of the Town of Campbellton to grant to each year a sum in aid of the Hotel Dieu Hospital in the Town of Campbellton.

To amend 60 Victoria, Chapter 58, Section 42 by providing for the declaration by the Town Clerk of the election of Councillors at large at the close of the poll.

To repeal 51 Victoria, Chapter 81, Section 11 and substituted in lieu thereof a section providing that each elector vote in the ward in which he resides and non-residents in the ward in which they have real estate, and if holding real estate in more than one ward, then in the ward designated by the Town Clerk.

To amend 51 Victoria, Chapter 81, Section 9 by striking out the words "in the ward" in the second last line.

To repeal 51 Victoria, Chapter 81, Section 13 and insert a section providing for the disqualification of Mayor and Councillors.

To amend 51 Victoria, Chapter 81, Section 10 and 61 Victoria, Chapter 41, Section 1 by providing for ballot containing all the names of candidates and the manner of holding election.

To amend Section 25, 4 George V, Chapter 69, by providing for the appointment of the three assessors at the Quarterly meeting in January.
