LIQUOR LAW CHANGES.

In his annual report Rev. W. D. Wilson, chief inspector under the liquor act, recommends changes for effective dealing with extracts, etc.; limitation of quantity that may be prescribed; for a wholesale government dispensary to guarantee quality and fair price. The inspector's staff took 874 penalties. There were 498 convictions and seventy-six dismissals. Eleven appeals were taken by defendants to the supreme court. Nine cases are still to be heard; two resulted in reduction of fines.
