CANADA WARNED.

On more than one occasion recently

The Financial Post, Toronto, has been

instructed to establish that too much

protection is a danger Canada has care-

fully to guard against. The Financial

Post, Montreal, another repre-

Canadians for the most part have

been hands up for what we please to

call protection. But let it be known

discussion. Their opinions challenge

interest and attention far greater than

attaches to the clapping of the ordi-

power, however, the Liberal party

would secure the best advice it could

on the board and general matters

of marketing and would lay down

a course in the interests of all Cana-

dians.

The questions of the Senate reform

came up when Mr. King attached

senatorial appointments made recent-

ly. Asked if he intended to abolish

the Senate, Mr. King said that if there

was an attempt by the "Tory majority

to block all reform measures," there

would soon be an insistent demand

for Senate reform.
