HAMILTON, May 30.—"It's all a terrible mistake," said Miss Evelyn Playter, of this city, telephoning to the Dundas police officials to-night about John A. McCutcheon, who was being held in Dundas on a charge of stealing her automobile. Mr. McCutcheon is an insurance broker, of Hamilton, and owns the car in question. Miss Playter is his stenographer. She took the car to her home this evening. Later her employer dropped around and drove off in the car without letting her know.

When the stenographer realized that the car was gone she at once called up police headquarters here and gave the number and said she was certain the car had been stolen. Dundas was the place which Mr. McCutcheon drove to.

It took about three-quarters of an hour to straighten out the tangle. Then the Hamilton man was given Godspeed by the Dundas police and returned home.

FORTY UNIONISTS IN ULSTER PARLIAMENT; COUNT IS COMPLETE

BELFAST, May 30.—With the election of P. O'Neill, Nationalist, for Down, the Ulster Parliament is complete. It is made up of 46 Unionists, six Sinn Feiners and six Nationalists.

The corporation has granted Sir James Craig, the Ulster leader, permission to use the city hall for the preliminary meeting of the new Parliament. The preliminary meeting will take place on June 7 and the opening ceremony will occur on June 21.

DAVID HASTINGS SUES FOR \$50,000

Dunnville Man Starts Action Against Hon. W. E. Raney

HAMILTON, May 30.—(Canadian Press Dispatch.)—Legal proceedings, which were threatened on behalf of David Hastings, of Dunnville, suspended police magistrate, against Attorney-General Raney, at the time of the investigation by John A. Paterson, K. C., Toronto, of Hastings' administration of the O. T. A., were started to-day when for

a writ was issued by Walter Robb, of Cayuga, against Mr. Raney for \$50,000 damages.

The action is the outcome of charges which Hastings states were made against him by the attorney-general, when a Dunnville deputation waited upon the attorney-general and asked for Hastings' reinstatement as magistrate. The alleged charges were not on the list furnished to Commissioner Paterson in connection with the investigation.

Mr. Paterson's report was handed to the Government just before the prorogation of the last session of the Legislature. In it was a recommendation that Mr. Hastings be asked for his resignation. The resignation has not been forthcoming and, as far as it is known, it has not yet been asked for.



BRITISH HOUSE TALKS BORAH RESOLUTION

LONDON, May 30.—(Associated Press Cable.)—The Borah resolution, recently passed by the United States Senate, suggesting the calling of an international disarmament conference, to be participated in by representatives of Great Britain, Japan and the United States, was under discussion in the Commons to-day. Replying to a question regarding the passage of the Borah resolution, Mr. Lloyd George said he had observed the proceedings in the Senate, but he had not yet received any invitation from President Harding to consider the mutual limitation of naval armaments.

Another questioner wanted to know whether in the meantime Great Britain would cease further construction. As to this the premier said he did not think that had been done in any part of the world. Everything would depend, he added, upon whether the resolution in question was put into operation.
