RAILWAY MEETINGS.—On the 4th, instant,

Assembly to grant Scrip towards the con-
struction of the St. Andrews and Quebec
Rail Road. We learn that several animated

Town on the 21 inst. the proceedings of
the Meeting have been published.

Railway Meetings have also been held at

by paying a small fee.

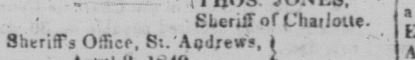

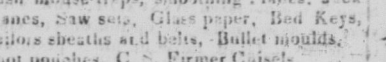
