and was 28.750 inches, giving a range of 2.024 inches.

The mean temperature of the month was 19°21, which is somewhat more than 5° higher than the *Isotherm* for Montreal. The highest temperature was on the 23rd day, and was 89 o 7. The lowest temperature was on the 14th day, and was 20 ° 8 below zero, giving a monthly range of 60 ° 6.

Rain fell on six days amounting to 1.586 inches. Snow fell on six-

teen days, amounting to 31.89 inches.
