ARTICLE 27

(1) This Convention shall replace, in relations between the countries of Union, the Convention of Berne of the 9th September 1886, and the subsethent revisions thereof. The Instruments previously in force shall continue to applicable in relations with countries which do not ratify this Convention.

(2) The countries on whose behalf this Convention is signed may retain benefit of the reservations which they have previously formulated, on definition that they make declaration to that effect at the time of the deposit of heir ratifications.

(3) Countries which are at present members of the Union, but on whose (3) Countries which are at present members of the half this Convention is not signed, may accede to it at any time, in the manner this Convention is not signed, may accede to it at any short of the benefit of th Novisions of the preceding paragraph.

ARTICLE 27bis
