PRAYERS

Mr. Boulanger, from the Standing Committee on Veterans Affairs, presented the Third Report of the Committee, which is as follows:

Pursuant to its Order of Reference of Monday, October 21, 1974 your Committee has considered Bill C-4, An Act to amend the War Veterans Allowance Act and the Civilian War Pensions and Allowances Act, and has agreed to report it with the following amendments:

Clause 6

Strike out lines 42 to 46 on page 9 and substitute the following therefor:

- “(g) any allowance paid,
 (i) under the *Family Allowances Act*, 1973, or
 (ii) under a law of a province that provides for payment of an allowance similar to the family allowance provided under the *Family Allowances Act*, 1973,
 in respect of any orphan or in respect of the oldest dependent child of a widow, widower or unmarried veteran;”

Strike out lines 3 to 5 on page 10 and substitute the following therefor:

- (3) Subsection (2) is deemed to have come into

Clause 16

Strike out in the French version lines 34 to 42 on page 19, and substitute the following therefor:

“70. (1) La définition de l'expression «enfant à charge» qui figure au paragraphe 2(1), le paragraphe 2(3), les articles 4, 6, 10 à 21 et 29 et le paragraphe 31(13) de la Loi sur les allocations aux anciens combattants, ainsi que l'annexe de cette loi, s'appliquent mutatis mutandis à une allocation payable en vertu de la présente Partie.”
