The improved lands increased from 51,000,000 acres to 77,000,-000, and the grain raised shows a similar increase, viz:

Lorin Blodget, in a remarkable pamphlet on "the Commercial and Financial Strength of the United States," 1864, shows that the "quantities handled" in 1863 were "more than thirty per cent. over the quantities of 1860," and gives the following table of "Domestic Exports of the Loyal States":
