He disputed the validity of the note.

The widow and five children of the late Jacob Limberg have again failed to recover damages from his employer, Michael Wallberg, for his death. Limberg, formerly an operative in a boot factory in London, England, was six in this country when he was crushed to death a year ago under the wall of a house on Sherbourne street,

where he was working.

Mr. Justice Britton dismissed the action whose decision was upheld by the appellate division, as it was held that the dead man had exceeded his instructions.



The sole head of a tamily, or an, male over 13 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

cept where residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3,00 per acrs.
