

WAS UNDER SPELL OF WEE AND DRINK

W. F. Hamilton Had Two-Fold Reason for Signing Promissory Note.

GERMAN IN NAME ONLY

Nerlich and Company May Collect Debts as They Are Canadians.

The appellate division yesterday dismissed the appeal of William F. Hamilton of Peterboro against the judgment awarding him the sum of \$4,000 on a note with interest. Hamilton declared that he was under his wife's influence when he gave the note, and further, that he was under the influence of drink and noxious drugs and that he was in a state of imbecility and incapable of understanding the most ordinary business matters. He disputed the validity of the note.

Did Not Follow Rules.

The widow and five children of the late Jacob Limberg have again failed to recover damages from the employer, Michael Walberg, for his death. Limberg, formerly an operative in a boot factory in London, England, was six months in this country when he was crushed to death a year ago under the wall of a house on Sherbourne street, where he was working.

Mr. Justice Britton dismissed the action, whose decision was upheld by the appellate division, as it was held that the dead man had exceeded his instructions.

Has Right to Be Tried.

The appellate division yesterday held that H. B. Ostrander of Schumacher Ont. is not to be denied his right of trial, thus setting aside the decision of Judge Snider in an action brought by H. B. Ostrander of Hamilton against Ostrander, Ostrander, and Judge Snider directed judgment for the plaintiff unless defendant gave \$400 security. The appellate division holds that a defence having been entered judgment cannot be given against the defendant in default of security.

The Harris Abattoir Company entered an action at Osgoode Hall yesterday against the Bank of Montreal and Bungalow of Burlington to recover \$88,774, alleged due on account of provisions.

An order winding-up the partnership of Hill & Harlick, 189 Simcoe street, was made yesterday by Mr. Justice Middleton. A reference to the accounts was directed to the master in ordinary.

Appeal Courts Today.

The following cases are down for hearing in the appellate divisional courts today:

First divisional court—Jesse v. Fairlie, Pickering v. The City of York Radial, Fauquier v. King, Neal and Town of Port Hope, Rundle v. Trusts and Guarantee, Wood v. Troman-hauser.

Second divisional court—Soper v. Windsor, Toronto Taxicab v. Toronto Railway, Davis v. Hudson Bay Mines, re Messenger Estate, Rundle v. Trusts and Guarantee, Wood v. Troman-hauser.

Must Pay the Debt.

In an action heard before Judge Merson in the division court yesterday brought by Nerlich & Company to recover a debt from Smith, the defence was that the plaintiffs were Germans and could not recover. It was shown in evidence, however, that both members of the firm were British subjects and therefore entitled to recover, and judgment was given in favor of the company.

Seventeen Mortgage Actions.

Since the announcement was made by the Hon. Dr. Pyne of the projected provincial moratorium, seventeen mortgage actions have been entered at Osgoode Hall, and judgments by default have been given in five cases, totaling \$10,432. As it is said the moratorium will be retroactive, these proceedings can be of no effect except where there has been a sale.

Appellants Failed.

The appeal of E. B. Brandon and Robert Boyd from the decision of Mr. Justice Middleton, in which he awarded \$724, was dismissed by the appellate divisional court yesterday. The claim was for work done at Milton under contract which called for payment at the rate of \$62 a day, but defendants claimed that this did not include Sunday, which was included in the bill from Oct. 6 to Dec. 23, 1910.

J. M. Lord of Windsor appealed against the judgment for \$500 awarded in favor of Samuel Oliver, a teamster, who was knocked down from his wagon and injured when two automobiles, one of which was owned by Lord, collided at a Windsor street corner. The appeal was dismissed.

Flour Order for War.

ST. LOUIS, Oct. 1.—A rush order for 110,000 bushels of flour was placed with a local company yesterday by representatives of one of the warring European nations, the identity of which was not disclosed. This is the largest single order of flour ever made here. The flour will be made of Kansas wheat and will require 540,000 bushels. Shipments from Kansas fields to St. Louis will begin within a few days, and the flour will be rushed to New York as fast as made. The price was not made public.

FIRE DID DAMAGE TO GALT BUSINESS BLOCK

Property Owned by Toronto Man—Loss May Reach Ten Thousand Dollars.

GALT, Oct. 1.—Starting in a shed at the rear of a building, fire did considerable damage this afternoon to a block on Main street, owned by Mr. Brock Wilkins of Toronto. The lower portion of the building is occupied by F. Brown & Sons, Oriental Bazaar, which suffered mostly from damage by smoke and water, as fire made its way to the upper stories.

The damage to a valuable stock of Brown & Son, however, is considerable, and may total \$10,000, covered by insurance.

The war pressure was good and within half an hour the fire department had the blaze extinguished.

BROCKVILLE, Ont., Oct. 1.—Florence Grigg, 3, was kicked and rendered unconscious by a horse grazing on the side of the C.P.R. loop line. She was thrown across the rails in front of a moving train, and only the vigilance of a brakeman saved her life. He noticed the child in time to give the engineer a signal to stop, and the train was brought to a standstill a few yards from her. She recovered later from the shock of the kick.

WALKED FROM VANCOUVER.

BROCKVILLE, Ont., Oct. 1.—Jack Fitzhugh, who left Vancouver, B.C., on May 1 to walk across the continent, his destination being Halifax, N.S., reached here yesterday, and after a short stay left for Montreal and from there will proceed to the maritime provinces. He passed thru the Canadian northwest south of Winnipeg and on an average covered twenty miles per day.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH- WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

The sole head of a family, or any male over 15 years old, may homestead a quarter section of land in the Northwest. Applicant must appear in person at the District Office, or by proxy, may be made at any Dominion Land Office (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 160 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Duties—Six months' residence in each of three years after earning homesteaded land; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption notice must be obtained as soon as homesteaded patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Six months' residence in each of three years after earning homesteaded land; also 50 acres extra cultivation. FORT HENRY FLOWS OVER WITH GERMAN PRISONERS

Three Latest Interned Are Held at Toronto Barracks—More Expected Soon.

Owing to overcrowding at Fort Henry, Kingston, Germans under arrest are being housed at the Toronto Barracks. Already only three foreigners are being detained there now, it is expected that early next week will see the number increased to 15.

One of the most recent German arrests is Carl von Bimberg, a university graduate and reservist. At the outbreak of the war he was in London, England, and came to Toronto without a permit from the English authorities. The police allege that his father was killed in South Africa when fighting for the Boers.
