

## THE SENATE OF CANADA

### BILL Y<sup>16</sup>.

An Act for the relief of Jean Louis Larose.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Jean Louis Larose, domiciled in Canada and residing at the city of Montreal, in the province of Quebec, manufacturer's agent, has by his petition alleged that on the nineteenth day of October, A.D. 1940, at St-Augustin, in the said province, he and Augustine Desjardins, who was then of St-Augustin aforesaid, a spinster, were married; and whereas by his petition he has prayed that, because of her adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of his petition be granted: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage dissolved.

1. The said marriage between Jean Louis Larose and Augustine Desjardins, his wife, is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

Right to marry again.

2. The said Jean Louis Larose may at any time hereafter marry any woman whom he might lawfully marry if the said marriage with the said Augustine Desjardins had not been solemnized.
