

Press Day Today At the Exhibition FISHERIES DAY GREAT SUCCESS Musical Program Great Attraction

CANADA'S GREAT FISHERIES CONSTANTLY THE BIG FEATURE OF EXHIBITION'S PROGRAM

First Fisheries Day Gave Visitors an Insight Into One of the Dominion's Greatest Resources and the Value of Fish as a Food Was Particularly Emphasized.

Attendance yesterday 44,000; last year 42,000; record year, 69,000. Total attendance for five days is 57,000 ahead of the corresponding days last year.

Phonics Day at the Canadian National Exhibition brought another big crowd to the grounds. National sentiment and public approval are this year backing the fair in a manner unexampled.

Thousands of people, a large proportion of young men, thousands of flags, miles of bunting, martial music that sets the blood tingling, a panorama in front of the grand stand calculated to draw out every spark of patriotism—this is the setting, and if the Exhibition authorities had planned for nothing else than a huge recruiting campaign, plans could not have been laid more suitably.

Yesterday, like every other day, was no exception to the spirit of the times. Emphasis was laid upon Canada's wonderful resources in fisheries. The vast wealth, as yet practically untouched, was dealt with in detail by Hon. J. D. Hazen in his address to the directors, and his guests at luncheon.

The streams, rivers and lakes abound in fish. The 3000 miles of coast line, with its coves and inlets, provide fishing places rich in quality and quantity. The safety provided by these makes the occupation less hazardous.

These points were brought out to stimulate Canadian and when a great natural resource is linked up with a desire to serve nothing but success can be the outcome.

"The fish industry was a comparatively old means of earning a livelihood, for in the days of our Saviour, it was from among the fishermen that He drew His most illustrious disciples."

Speaking about the disastrous results of the war upon the fish industry, the minister said "owing to the lack of transportation facilities, it was impossible to supply fresh fish to markets at a considerable distance from the coasts, as the fisherman had not then learned the art of curing fish."

There is now invested in fishing gill vessels and other accommodations of the industry about \$24,000,000, of which \$22,000,000 being invested in the sea fisheries. While the fisheries are now
