INDIAN CABINS AT YAAS BAY.— These are the homes of empages of the adjoining cannery, which furnishes the principal occupation for nearly all of the Indians in this section during the season. They are found to be more reliable workmen than the Indians in the United States. The men are mostly encaged a canding the fish, the squaws in canning them, while Chinamen make the cans. All steamships in Alaskan parts are very largely loaded and unloaded by Indians, and they are regularly employed in various durins. The people here are rather primitive nother habits and habitations, but live their simple lives undisturbed by the tunnil and toil of fortune, fame or fashion; and peace and sweet content are frequently found in their midst.
