fundamental principles of a government, intended to be given to a conquered kingdom. First, To adopt a government suitable to the genius of the people; Secondly, One that does not violate a treaty of peace, and thereby lesien the faith of the nation, and leave open a just clause to invade the tranquillity of the kingdom in future; Thirdly, One that can be executed with the fewest inconveniences, and be supported with the least expence. How far the present bill is likely to effect these ends, I shall examine, and consider the objections pleaded against it, and prove that they are founded upon false and erroneous principles; which I should be happy if I could think they arose from an inconsiderate attention to the subject, and the intention of the bill, than an uniform, confistent plan of conduct, which characterises the opposers of it.
