

No Breadth to Day's Trading Wheat Markets Dull and Lower

Nothing in Situation to Change Sentiment at Chicago and Market Drags Heavily—Winnipeg Closes Easier.

Liverpool wheat futures closed to-day unchanged from yesterday; corn futures unchanged to 1/4 lower than yesterday.
At Chicago, December wheat futures closed 1/4 lower than yesterday, December corn 1/4 lower, and December oats 1/4 lower.
At Winnipeg, December wheat closed 1/4 higher than yesterday, December oats unchanged.
Chicago car lots to-day: Wheat, 24,000; corn, 500; contract, 2,000.
Winnipeg receipts of wheat to-day were 15 cars, against 17 1/2 a week ago and 14 1/2 a year ago. Total receipts of wheat to-day were 31 cars, against 34 a week ago and 42 a year ago. Minneapolis, 219, 220, 247.

ST. LAWRENCE MARKET.
Receipts of farm produce on Saturday were 400 bushels of grain, a few loads of hay, several lots of dressed hogs, a moderate number of loads of mixed produce in the north building, with a large supply of butter, eggs and poultry on the market.
Trade was good in every department, as usual, and everybody getting ready for Christmas this coming week.
Prices were good all round, and a little firmer for poultry.
Barley—Five hundred bushels sold at 50c to 52c.
Oats—One hundred bushels sold at 36c to 38c per ton.
Poultry—Turkeys sold at from 22c to 25c per lb., the bulk going at 22c to 24c, geese 14c to 16c per lb., ducks, 15c to 18c; chickens, 15c to 17c per lb., hens, 12c to 13c.
Eggs—Strictly fresh laid eggs sold at 30c to 32c per dozen, and we saw one dozen all laid last week, go at 50c. But 50c to 52c were the ruling prices.
Butter—Prices for butter were about the same, at 26c to 28c per lb.

Market Notes.
There was a fine lot of poultry of good quality, the best of the season.
John Barron, J. L. Peterson (for Swan Bros), the Harris Abattoir Company, and J. Tomalin were the principal buyers at the market.
A. Thompson, the King street grocer, at the entrance to the market, got many fine lots of poultry.
J. W. Stephenson, the Yonge street farmer, again got the top price for chickens, having sold eight choice birds at 12c per lb.
The butcher, one and all, had a fine lot of meats and poultry, and were all busy, as there was a continuous stream of customers coming and going all day.

**SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-
WEST LAND REGULATIONS.**

ANY person who is the sole head of a
family, or who has over 18 years
available Dominion land in Manitoba,
Saskatchewan or Alberta, the applica-
tion must appear in person
Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency
at the present session, or by proxy may
be made at any Agency, on certain
conditions, but the mother, son, daugh-
ter, brother or sister of intending home-
steader—Six months' residence upon
and cultivation of the land in each of
three years. A homesteader may live
within five miles of the homestead on
a farm of at least 50 acres so long as he
and occupied by him or by his father,
mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

On certain districts a homesteader in
good standing may pre-empt a quarter-
section alongside his homestead. Price
\$5.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six
months in each of six years from date
of homestead, and erect a house of 10
feet required to earn homestead patent and
cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his
homestead right and cannot obtain
pre-emption may enter for a purchased
homestead of 40 acres. Price—\$10.00
per acre. Duties—Must reside six
months in each of three years, cultivate
fifty acres and erect a house of 10
feet.
