however, very desirable, if not essential, that legislation be now enacted to prevent the further depletion or diversion of waters of the river and to furnish a basis for diplomatic action.

Large Powers for Secretary.

In the bill presented a very large responsibility is imposed upon the secretary of war. This course has been filed by the joint commission on international waterways, including both the members from the United States and those from Canada, in which the principle of equality in the amount to be diverted on both sides by the States and Canada is asserted. In the opinion of the committee, this rule should be followed. At the present time, however, the preparation for diversion has been greater on the Signature of Miagara Falls and of the rapids of said river. It is hoped that such action may be taken by diplomatic negotiations as will be equal and that the secretary of war will keep this principle in view.
