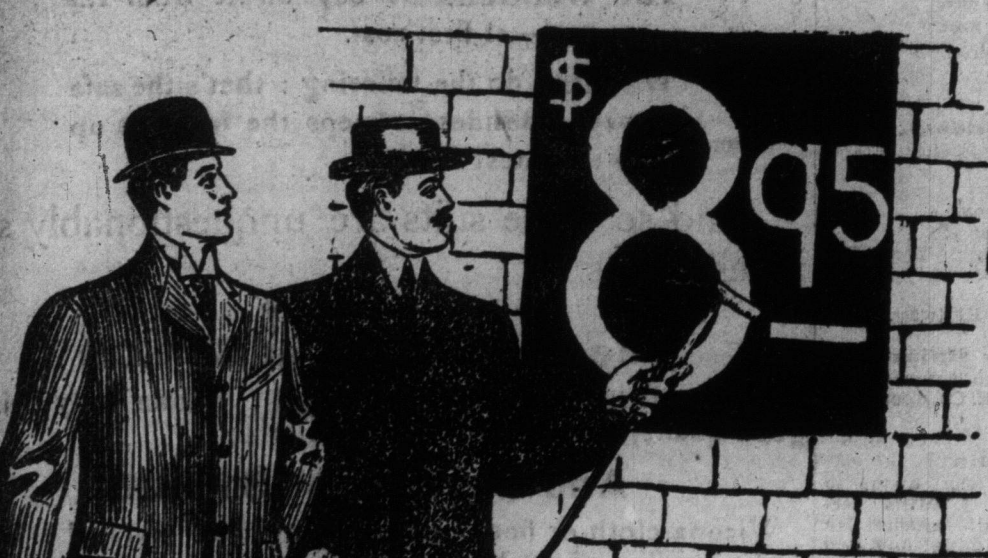

EXPLORE NORTH COUNTRY ROSS GIVES GOOD ADVICE

Tells the Senate How Ontario Profited From New Ontario Investigations.

Ottawa, Jan. 24.—(Special).—There was some discussion in the senate this afternoon respecting the appointment of a committee and an exploring party to investigate Ungava, Keewatin and Labrador.

This gave Hon. Geo. W. Ross an opportunity for a maiden speech. He said it was most important to have the knowledge of our northern resources as soon as possible. Ontario had sent out exploring parties, each of which included a geologist, a surveyor, an agricultural expert, and a forester. Each party had a limited area of the northland of Ontario to cover, and it had been seen a line between spring and autumn.

The report had been a surprise to everyone. It had shown unsuspected resources of minerals, timber and agricultural stretches. It had reported on the great agricultural area in the northland of Ontario, which comprises about sixteen million acres. One result of the exploration and report was the construction by the government of the Temiskaming Railway. The exploration had cost \$75,000, and one of the direct results was a profit of \$1,000,000. There was an offer to the province of from fifteen to twenty million dollars for a very small area of land opened up for settlement.

The Dominion could, he thought, undertake exploration with an assurance of profitable return. He favored the committee being appointed, and thought its duty should be to point the way to a policy of exploration.
