At the Empire Club Thursday J. Castell Hopkins, the guest of the hour, read a paper entitled "The Formation of Canadian Opinion.'

He said that nearly all Canada's imperialistic views and ideas of British institutions were drawn from sources which distorted the facts and colored the sentiments with a distinctly non-British or anti-British tint, and these channels of information were, even when heading from London, directed and employed by and for the people of the United States.


