GRAIN IS UNSTEADY
ON GOVT. CROP REPORTChicago Market for Futures is De-
cidedly Feverish—Foreign
Prices Are Lower.

Tuesday Evening, Sept. 10.
Liverpool wheat futures closed 1/4d lower than yesterday; corn 1/4d to 1/2d lower. Chicago car lots: Wheat 25c, contract 27; corn 55c, contract 18; oats 35c, contract 15.
At Chicago September wheat closed 1/4d lower than yesterday. Sept. corn closed 1/4d lower, and September oats 1/4d lower.
Northwest car lots to day 49c, last week 74c, year ago 88c.
Primary receipts wheat to day 74,000, shipments 45,000; last week 120,000, shipments 1,022,000; year ago 1,100,000, shipments 468,000. Corn to day 916,000, 431,000; last week 867,000, 434,000; year ago 922,000, 468,000.

ST. LAWRENCE MARKET.

Receipts of farm produce were 200 bushels of grain, 20 loads of hay, a few lots of dressed hogs, and several loads of potatoes.
