BEKONDRIKERS DROWNED.

The Ice Breaks and a Party of Men Are Precipitated into a Rushing

San Francisco, May 9.—Word has reached here that on Monday last the ice covering a stream in a dingle near Crater Lake gave way under the passing throng of Klondikers and more than a score of men were precipitated into the water and drowned. Dr. J. F. Fritzel, of Los Angeles, who brought the news, passed the scene only a few hours after the calamity occurred. It was in the canyon some 14 miles above Stone House, where an ice slide over a mountain stream has been utilized as a path for sleds. A number of men were advancing in almost unbroken ranks, each hauling a heavily laden sled, when there was a sudden crash. The ice opened for 30 feet or more and the instant twenty-two men, with their camp, were whirled down and under the surface of the machine rain. They were not even the chance of drifting for life.

GOLD MILL BURNED.

Some of the Precious Metal Was Lost—A Gold Mill Burned in the State of Nevada.

Marmora, Ont., May 9.—On Sunday morning about 4 o'clock fire broke out in the big mill belonging to the Canadian Gold Fields Co. at Delors. The fire originated from drying machines, where the man left fire. The fire spread rapidly and in a few minutes the mill was a mass of flames. There was a big wind blowing, and one of the men was awakened near by and went in to try to save some precious belongings, and he states that he saw many men running all about the mill. He got there. It is said that the mill was insured for \$41,000. The company was just erecting a new crusher in the same building, and intended to move the machinery to the new one. It is said that there was a quantity of gold under treatment in the laboratory, about \$200 worth. The laboratory was a complete wreck, not one thing being saved. A number of sleds, each hauling a heavy load, were in the yard, and about 20 men were thrown out of employment. Loss estimated at \$75,000. The insurance was in the New York Union.

Brussels Voted Wisely.

Brussels, Ont., May 9.—A frontage brawl, having reference to new sewers on Main Street and placing the building of all Main Street, was broken up by a vote of 10-8. Only nine votes were recorded against the brawl, and two of these were by mistake of voters. The expectation is that grandiose walks will replace the plank, and at least on Main Street sewers will be put down this summer.
