INCREASED ATTENDANCE OVER FIRST ESTIMATES IS EXPECTED FOR GENERAL ASSEMBLY HERE

Acceptances of Commissioners to Big Presbyterian Church Meeting Coming In—More Billets Required.

Latest returns indicate that the attendance at the general assembly of the Presbyterian Church of Canada in this city, opening the first week in June, will be larger than was expected when the railroads advanced their rates and cancelled all special rates. As a result, more billets are required for the assembly than were expected. The local committee, in charge of the assembly, is in charge of the billets. The earlier replies from commissioners brought in a number of cancellations. As the assembly approaches the majority of letters contain announcements that the commissioners are coming.

McIntosh, chairman of the local committee, stated that he had begun to look as if it would be made up largely of this year of prominent men of the church, and that others from more obscure places would be prevented from coming owing to the extra expense involved.

QUERIES REGARDING MILITARY SERVICE

Send In Your Problems and They Will Be Answered From Official Information by The Advertiser.

MITCHELL, Ont. Q.—What are the rules regarding registration in June? Is it only citizens who have to register or is it everybody over 16 years of age? Is an American, 19 years old, in this draft?

Ans.—You have evidently confused the national registration under which all persons over 16 of all nationalities must register for national service, and the registration under the military service act which calls upon unmarried British subjects of 16 and 20 years of age to register for military service.

The American would go to the registration booths for national registration, but he would not need to mail his name to the registrar under the M. S. A.

S. H. Q.—If I was born September 25, 1899, do I come in on this draft?

Ans.—If you are not yet 19 you are not called upon to register yet.

PARKHILL, Q.—Does a man born on November 13, 1895, come in on the age of 20 to 22 draft?

Ans.—Yes, if he is in category A.

HEATHCOTE, Ont. Q.—1. Would a 19-year-old man have a chance of exemption if his older brother is called up, but is not over 21? 2. Can they take a widow's only support and leave a wife, farm and stock?

Ans.—He cannot get exemption at that age, but he might apply to his commanding officer for leave of absence on the grounds mentioned.

O. R. R. Q.—1. A man who was married before July, 1917, has received orders to report upon a certain day, according to the recent order-in-council. What will he have to do to have the report on the stated day, submitting proof that he was married before July, 1917?

Ans.—1. Unless he registered with the single men last fall under the M. S. A. he is hard to understand. The registrar could have obtained his name. If there is not time to take the matter up with the registrar, let him report as ordered, and then take it up with both the registrar and his commanding officer.

SCOTTIE, Q.—1. I will be 19 years old in September. When am I liable to be called?

Ans.—1. I am almost blind in the left eye. Will this make me ineligible for infantry?

Ans.—3. Can you pick your unit if you are called? 4. Can you be home again and wait till the men of his category were called, or would he have to line up in coming open to the B men at that time?

Ans.—4. Yes. 5. O. C. Service Company, Canadian Engineers, Carling Heights Camp, London, Ont.

W. R. L. Q.—To whom would I write regarding enlistment in the steel-armed cavalry?

Ans.—Write to Major C. O. Fairbank, Wolsey Barracks, London, Ont.

J. G. G. Q.—1. I am 18 years old, and an American, but at present am in Canada. Can I get my name on my allegiance to United States by registering under the M. S. A.?

Ans.—2. If I registered in Canada on June 22, when I reach my 19th year, would be called to enlist in Canada under the M. S. A.?

Ans.—3. No; the registration includes every person who is in Canada, and has to do with national service and not military service.

Ans.—4. No; only British subjects residing in Canada are affected by the M. S. A.

LISTOWEL, Q.—Has a farmer, category B, the right to appeal after his exemption has been refused by the local tribunal?

Ans.—Yes; B men have the same right to appeal as other men. Apply to the registrar on the back of the notification which told him that his claim was refused, and address it to him at the Royal Bank Building, London, Ont.

Merlin, Ont. Q.—I am to report in London on the 25th. I was sent a pass on the Pere Marquette Railroad, which has no train out until 6 o'clock. Can I get a train out not reach London until late. Jeanette is the nearest station. Can I reach London early after dinner, if I go by the 6 o'clock train?

Ans.—1. I would reach London by the 6 o'clock train, and would get my money back; if not, would you advise me to do so?

Ans.—2. Yes; you will be met by the military escorting staff.

F. McG. Q.—I have been ordered to report in London on the 25th. I am married now. Will my wife receive separation allowance? If so, how much?

Ans.—1. Yes; he is ordered to report he is a soldier on the strength of his battalion, and must get the money to get married. He can then claim separation allowance, which for the rank of private is \$55 per month.

C. C. Q.—1. What is the wages of a soldier? 2. Are they the same as paid a volunteer?

Ans.—1. Does a soldier get part of his wages paid direct to him overseas, and the rest paid to anyone he names?

Ans.—2. If so, can he have it paid to anyone in the United States?

Ans.—3. Does a man who was examined last fall and placed in Category A have another medical examination?

Ans.—4. He may have. Let him apply for it, and the tribunal will decide.

Keene, Ont. Q.—Will a 19-year-old who has to go overseas have the privilege to choose what unit he wishes to join at any time before July, after which that class is to be called?

Ans.—Instructions issued by the military authorities state that such a man who enlisted before June 1 are to be regarded as volunteers, and therefore they could be sent to any unit. No ruling has been made with regard to those who enlisted after June 1, but before notified to report in July. Men of other ages who come in before notified to report have the privilege of choice of unit, and it may be possible that these men will have the same.
