

REPORT ON SOLDIER RE-ESTABLISHMENT TABLED AT OTTAWA

Forty-Four Hospitals and Sanatoria Operated by Department.

OTTAWA, March 15 .- The report of the minister of soldiers' civil re-establishment was tabled in the House of Commons this afternoon by Col. Hugh Clarke of Bruce. The report, which covered the period from May 18, 1918. to December 31, 1919, sets forth that Canada's work in vocational training compares most favorably with that of the United Kingdom.

Hospital and sanatoria directly op-erated by the department numbered forty-four and partially operated, six. The department had agreements for a certain number of beds in each of fifty-four hospitals. The number of inpatients treated was 6,520, out-patients 1,634. The average number of outside clinic treatments per week during






