## DONAU, FAVORITE, WINS THE KENTUCKY DERBY

Great Crowd Present to See Classic Event at Louisville in Almost Record Time.

LOUISVILLE, May 10.—Donau, the bay son of Woodthorpe, to-day captured the Kentucky Derby, at a mile and a quarter, in the sensational time of 2:06 3/4. Joe Morris was second and Fighting Bob third. The race was over a fast track, in the presence of the largest crowd in the history of local racing. The record for the classic is 2:03 1/4, made by Lieut. Gibson in 1903.
