NEW YORK, Dec. 5 .- Joe Kelley, the eteran ballplayer who managed the pennant-winning team of Toronto last pennant-winning team of Toronto last season, may decide to quit baseball playing altogether, says The American to-day, thus upsetting the designs of President Dovey, who has set his heart on getting Joseph to manage the Boston Nationais. Kelley's father-in-law, John J. Mahon, is now a power in Maryland politics, and he could easily make use of Kelley's executive ability on the political diamond. In fact, Kelley has received a hint to this effect, and he will not have to take an uncongenial job as manager of the Beaneaters if he does not want to.

Relief knows that they have a habit in Boston of frequently changing managers, and, having this in mind, he demanded a three-year contract from President Dovey. This the latter refused to give, doing so in a polite way by saying that Kelley could have a contract for one year, and would, no doubt, remain with the Boston team for many years to come

If Kelley refuses to go to Boston it will be impossible for him to remain in organized baseball. Boston regularly drafted him from Toronto for the insignificant sum of \$1000, and the National commission would have to uphold the baseball law. Kelley would rather stay in Toronto, where he is a big favorite, but the rules will not even allow him to manage the Toronto team from the bench.
