I have the honour to acknowledge with thanks receipt of your letter of the 13th instant regarding Kitsilano Reserve.

I wrote you on the 18th enclosing further reports on this subject, but your letter received yesterday will completely allay the fears of the Squamish Band and Council, and I shall notify them immediately. It is exactly what they need to renew their confidence in the Department, which has been somewhat shaken of late by the press reports and speeches of so many prominent men in Vancouver. The Secretary of the Council has already seen your letter, and was very pleased. I am afraid I have caused you extra trouble and correspondence by forwarding so many reports on Kitsilano Reserve, but thought it best to keep you posted upon developments, but will not send any more unless they appear to be important.
