TEAMS SELECTED TO FORM NEW LEAGUE

Barrow Will be Elected President at a Salary of \$10,000 a Year; Talk of New International League

New York, Nov. 6.—Newark, Baltimore, Buffalo and Toronto will formally resign from the International League, while Toledo, Columbus, Louisville and Indianapolis will secede from the American Association. The union league will operate under the protection of the National agreement.

The promoters of the new circuit are prepared to conduct business under the rules that have governed the International League, and the American Association for the past fifteen years. They will not demand representation on the National Baseball Commission, but it is possible that their clubs will be relieved from the drafting system, which will enable them to keep many of their best players. will be a big minor circuit covering the best eastern and western cities that cannot get into the National and American leagues for obvious reasons. FOOTBALL BOOMS IN BRITISH ISLES

Great Crowds Attend Games and Keen Interest Taken in Results

British soccer leagues are all enjoying prosperous seasons. Attendances have been large, and more enthusiasm is being shown than since the outbreak of the war. Attendances run from twenty to forty thousand, the latter figure being reached in Glasgow Cup games.

Of the Liverpool interest in the chief local teams, Liverpool and Everton, The Manchester Sporting Chronicle says: "The receipts at Goodison Park on Saturday were just below £1,000. Glasgow has often been described as 'the city of football,' but such a 'gate' as this will set the Scottish fathers thinking."

"This sum is a distinct tribute to the popularity of football in Liverpool, as well as a powerful argument in favor of 'carrying on,' whilst it reflects with equal lustre on the players themselves. The quality of their exhibition has been such that interest has never abated—may, it may be said to have increased, and when normal times are restored the clubs will, no doubt, remember the men who have been such good sportsmen and so loyal to their colors."
