

York, and it is satisfactory to be able to observe, that the Association has been benefitted by the change, both in the cost of the Magazines, and the manner in which they have been received. Some alteration was made in the Newspapers obtained for the Reading Room. One or two weekly papers, and several periodicals in the French language, have been substituted, without increase of expense, for the Journal des Débats and Le Siècle, Parisian Daily Papers, which were very costly, and were read by comparatively few of the members: the Albany Argus, the New York Literary World, the New Brunswicker, the St. John's (Newfoundland) Morning Courier, the Charlottetown (Prince Edward) Islander, the Montreal Courier, and the Morning Chronicle, have been procured this year, in addition to those formerly received, and the following is a correct list of the Magazines and Newspapers, which are now to be found in the Reading Room:—
