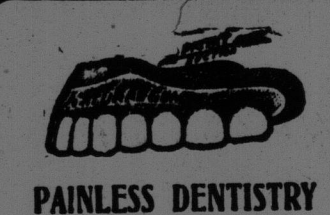
MR. CODY LECTURES BEFORE THE ART CLUB

Daniel McDonald of Shediac died on Sunday. He was fifty-two years old and a native of Richibucto, where the burial took place Tuesday morning. He left a widow, one son, at home, two step sons and three step daughters. Mrs. Lamont, Irelan, California; Mrs. Harvey Tombs, Charlottetown, P. E. I.; Mrs. Leandre LeBlanc, of Summerfield, P. E. I.
