BODY RECOVERED

River Gives up Remains of Dr. N. G. Trueman of Salem, Mass.

The body of Dr. N. G. Trueman, of Salem, Mass., who was drowned Monday, off Westmount, near Kellogg, on the Saint John River, was found floating in the water yesterday, off South Bay, three miles from the scene of drowning between one-half a mile and one mile from the shore, by Samuel Lunan and F. Osborne, South Bay residents, who were crossing the river to Raynes' Beach in a motorboat. The body was taken to the beach. Sergeant-Detective Powers and Detective Biddlecombe, as well as Corporal P. L. Kenney, were notified immediately and within a short time had arrived at South Bay. N. W. Brennan & Son, undertakers, were called by telephone, and after Corporal Kenney had given permission for the removal of the body, it was brought to the city. Sergeant Powers said last evening that Corporal Kenney had decided that no inquest would be held.

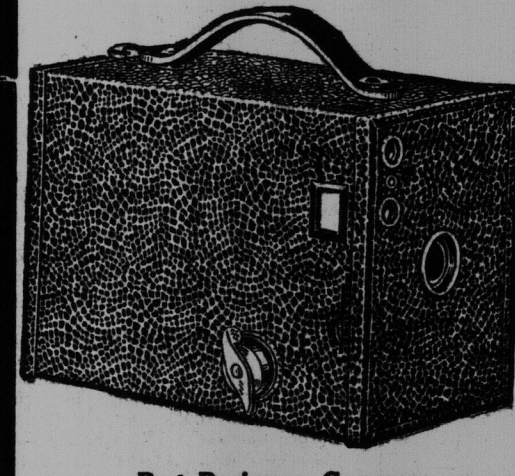
