## UB-SOX 1906 SERIES GOES INTO HISTORY; SCHULTE QUITS GAME

Chicago, Aug. 27. (Associated Press)—With Frank Schulte dropping out of the professional baseball ranks this season, the last of the two great coterie of ball players that battled for the championship in 1906 have retired from the game.

Frank Chance, of "Perfect" fame and Pat Moran, of the "Big Cat" fame, were the only two players left in the diamond in actual play.

At the time that Schulte resigned from the Oakland club of the Coast league, seven of the former stars of the 1906 teams still had something to do with baseball.

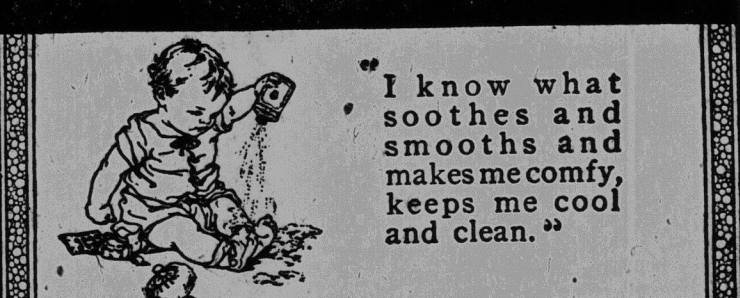

## Small Boats Used As Floating Cafes For Merry Bathers

Brisk Trade Obtained by Boatmen Offering Hot Weather Menus.

Berlin, Aug. 28.—Campers on the shores of the Spreewitz do not need to cook any meals this summer. Small boats operating along the banks of the river bring attractive hot-weather dishes, and some of the craft are equipped with steps at the side, so that bathers may climb aboard and buy whatever appeals—lemonade, sandwiches, beer or seltzer water.

The rapid growth of summer colonies, crowds of campers in the Spreewitz country who spend the day and most of the night at the water's edge, suggested to many that the operation of such boats would be a paying proposition. And now, here and there along the river banks, a sun-browned boatman may be seen sitting at the helm and offering his wares to the bathers. Bottles and sandwiches are kept in wet cloths on the floor of the boat, or in a refrigerator, if the salesman is quite prosperous. Empty bottles are collected on the next trip.

The most popular salesman is the one whose boat is arranged that the basking customers may come from him, and he must be prepared to wade ashore at any minute with the things they call for.

As the season advances the floating restaurant business grows more extensive. Different kinds of boats appear, and some merchants add to their stock such delicacies as small baskets of cherries and strawberries.

The latest improvement is the champagne or barber, who, like a doctor, takes the red-faced bathers on board and in some shady corner of the boat prescribes proper treatment for their burns. This salesman keeps on hand a good supply of vaseline, sal-ammoniac for cuts, bites, and other remedies.
