i jured as the result of a level railway crossing accident about a mile and a half from Norton Mills on Saturday. A three year old baby was in the Dougay automobile when it was struck by the Montreal-Newport afternoon train and was only slightly injured.

The Dougay's were motoring from Norton Mills to their home at Island Pond. They had the side curtains up as it was raining, and it is thought they did not see the train until the engine crashed full into the car completely shattering it and instantly killing Mrs. Dougay and her daughter. The baby, after being carried in front of the engine with his dead mother and sister for six hundred yards, escaped with a for six hundred yards, escaped with a few scratches. Alec Dougay died on the way to the Sherbrooke hospital where the son is now under treatment.


