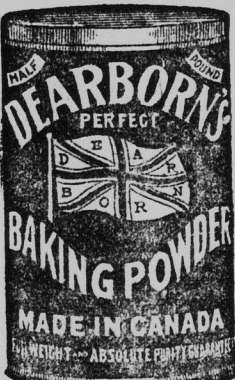

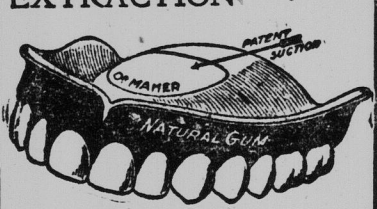

CHILD DEBT SLAVERY.  
London, Feb. 3.—Debt slavery, in which children are taken in pledge for what their parents owe still exists in Trengganu, one of the Unfederated Malay States under British protection, but is to be abolished, according to J. L. Humphreys, British official. The debt is treated as hereditary, the children are taken in pledge and no reduction is made in the debt on account of the labor of the debtor. The social, moral and economic abuses of the system are notorious.
