REPORT FOR 1890.

In presenting our report this year, we are pleased to be able to state that the year has been a most prosperous one. We have met regularly every month, and the meetings have been marked with increased interest and attendance.

There are forty-seven names on the roll, with an average attendance of twenty-nine. The average attendance may seem small in comparison to the number of names on the roll, but that is explained by the fact that we have a number of members who are unable to attend the meetings. The amount collected this year from the various sources is \$110.53, besides the box sent to Miss McLaren at Birtle, which was valued at \$35.00.

Special subscription for an emergency surgical case in the Congregation, for which Mrs. McCallum was Treasurer, \$200.

During the year five have withdrawn from the Band. Miss Jean Gordon, the 2nd Vice-President, left in June for India, and four have joined other congregations.

The letter leaflet has been received, and a number of letters read. These leaflets are most interesting, and it is hoped that next year each member will have one, which she may read for herself, as they contain a great deal of missionary intelligence which is well worth reading, and can be had for twelve cents a year. We desire to return thanks to our Father in Heaven for His blessing on our efforts in the year that has past, and pray that it may be continued to us during the year upon which we are about to enter.
