And now, dear Brethren, permit us to direct your attention to the great fact, which cannot be too often repeated, that our happiness as individuals, and our success as a religious community, depends on our entire devotedness to God. "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God;" for, "Without holiness

no man shall see God, even as he is like the earth"—"men." O let the truth, that God is true, as fruitless as off. Let, then, your conduct in families, as children of the community. Let us, in going to work, with simplicity, with emulation our Members profess an awful responsibility in the true spirit of the work, and always, show our principles of our mark for the people of Jesus."
