

BY-LAW No. 1.

By-Law Relating to Dogs.

The Council of the Village of MUFNSTER enacts as follows:

1. In this By-Law the word "dog" shall include bitch unless a contrary intention appears.

2. The owner, possessor or harbourer of every dog shall annually on or before the first day of May in each year or as soon thereafter as such dog shall attain the age of six months cause the same to be registered, numbered, described and licensed in the office of the Secretary-Treasurer and shall cause the dog to wear around its neck a collar, to which collar shall be attached a metallic plate having raised, cast or stamped thereon the letters V.L.S. (meaning village licence paid) and the figures indicating the year for which the license has been paid and a number corresponding with the number under which the said dog is registered, and every such owner, possessor or harbourer shall pay for such license, metallic plate and registration for each dog the sum of one dollar and for each bitch the sum of two dollars.

3. No license shall be required for any dog unless it is six months old.

4. No person shall permit his or her dog to run at large in the village without having around its neck the collar and metallic plate mentioned in the second section of this by-law.

5. No person shall remove the collar or metallic plate from a license dog.

6. No owner of any bitch shall suffer or permit the same to run at large while in heat.

7. No person shall register a bitch as a male dog.

8. Any owner of any dog known to be rabid shall not allow such dog to run at large in the village.

BY-LAW No. 2.

For the Prevention of Fire.

The Council of the Village of MUFNSTER enacts as follows:

1. No person shall keep on any premises a larger quantity of gunpowder or other explosives, than 25 pounds, unless it be stored at least 100 ft. from any building.

2. No person shall keep on any premises a greater quantity of coal oil or gasoline than 5 barrels, unless it be stored at least 66 ft. from any building.

3. No person shall have or erect on any premises any building built in whole or in part of manure, hay, straw or sod, or

place on the roof of any building any manure, hay, straw or sod.

4. No person shall have any stack of grain, hay or straw on any premises.

5. No person shall enter any stable or barn with any candle or lamp not enclosed in a lantern, or with a lighted pipe, cigar or cigarette.

6. No person shall set out any fire within 50 ft. of any building. Provided that any blacksmith may build a fire within 50 ft. of his shop for the purpose of his trade, but any blacksmith shall not leave any such fire burning without some fit person in charge thereof.

7. No person shall deposit ashes in any wooden container unless it be lined with metal.

8. All ovens and furnaces shall be properly connected with a chimney of brick, stone or concrete, at least 3 ft. higher than any building in which such oven or furnace is built.

9. There shall be a space of at least 9 inches between any stove pipe and any partition or floor through which it passes, unless such stove pipe be surrounded in such partition or floor by a thimble of brick, cement or concrete at least 2 inches in thickness and of the full depth of such partition or floor and every such stove pipe shall be inserted into a chimney of brick, cement or stone.

10. At least 12 inches shall intervene between any stove in use and the partition or wall nearest thereto.

11. Every proprietor or occupant of any house more than one story high, with a roof having a pitch greater than one foot in three, shall keep a ladder on such roof near the chimney thereof.

12. Every proprietor or occupant of any house shall keep a ladder on the premises sufficiently long to reach the roof of such house.

Any person contravening any of the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$10.00 and costs, and in default of payment thereof to imprisonment with or without hard labour in the nearest common goal for a period not exceeding thirty days, unless said fine and costs, including the cost of committal, are sooner paid.
