KAISER SUMMONS WAR STAFF TO CONFERENCE TO DISCUSS THE SUMMER CAMPAIGN

Geneva, via Paris, April 16.—According to reports which reached Basel today from Berlin and Vienna, Emperor William has ordered the principal German generals and also some of the Austrian commanders to meet him in a grand conference in order to discuss the coming summer campaign.

HON. FRANK OLIVER MAKES STATEMENT

Ottawa, April 16.—A statement in denial of the charges brought against him in parliament on Wednesday by Hon. Dr. Roche, Minister of the Interior, has been made by Hon. Frank Oliver. The statement has reference to the charge that Mr. Oliver withheld from the public treasury royalties on coal mined on land owned by him, but on which the mineral rights were reserved to the Crown, and to the charge that through this means of manipulation, made possible by his office as Minister of the Interior, Mr. Oliver obtained, through his son-in-law, Mr. Anderson, of Edmonton, certain public land and real-estate money thereon last autumn.

Mr. Oliver said that when making the lease he believed he owned the coal as well as the surface rights, although he recognized now he was clearly in error. He thought solicitors of the lease would have looked into his patent was not of sufficient early date, and got a lease of coal rights from Hon. Mr. Rogers, then Minister of the Interior. He had not promptly paid up royalties, because he had not been paid by the subsurface. Mr. Roche gave him an extension of time.

THE DAY'S WAR NEWS TOLD IN SHORT METRE

Official Organ in Vienna Denies Peace Stories—Bombs are Dropped on Amiens by Germans.

Peace Rumors Denied.

Vienna, via London, April 17.—The official Fremdenblatt declares that all reports of an alleged intention on the part of Austria to conclude a separate peace with Russia are devoid of foundation.

Germans Drop Bombs on Amiens.

Amiens, France, April 16.—Several bombs have been dropped by a German Taube aeroplane in the vicinity of the Cathedral here. Ten persons were killed or wounded. The material damage done was slight.

London, April 17 (2.30 a.m.)—The Amsterdam correspondent of Reuters' Telegram Company, writing under date of Friday, says:

"Turkish headquarters reports that a cruiser yesterday bombed the Dardanelles fortifications from the entrance."

"A Russian fleet has bombarded Eregh and Sungulidag (in Asia Minor, on the Black Sea)." "Russian Fleet Bombs Kara Burun"

London, April 17 (3.05 a.m.)—Telegraphing from Sofia under date of Thursday, the Times correspondent says:

"A Russian fleet has bombarded Kara Burun, which lies inside the Thracian line on the Black Sea, about fifteen miles north of Midia."

"Travellers from Dodegatch report that a fresh batch of German officers has arrived in Constantinople. They say also that the greater part of the garrison of Adrianople and Demotica have been withdrawn for the defence of the capital."
