## Rescued In Mid-Ocean

Six Men Taken Off Abandoned Schooner Asquith—One Sailor Lost Overboard.

Plymouth, Eng., Feb. 16.—The abandonment of the Newfoundland schooner Asquith in mid-Atlantic and the rescue of all but one of her crew by the U. S. steamer Albatross was reported by the six rescued men of the crew who arrived here today. One sailor was lost overboard. The schooner was in a sinking condition after a four day hurricane when the crew was taken off.

The Canadian Pacific Steamship Ltd. liner Pretorian arrived in port late Wednesday night from Glasgow with twenty-one cabin and fifty-four third class passengers.

The liner took the southern route across the Atlantic and had a good clear passage with the exception of a few days when strong winds and high seas were encountered. No icebergs were sighted and nothing eventful happened during the voyage.

At 9:15 o'clock yesterday morning she docked at No. 2 berth, Sand Point, and the passengers were landed soon afterwards. They were sent to their destinations on the regular trains yesterday afternoon. In addition to the passengers the liner brought 400 tons of general cargo and one car load of royal mail.

## Premier Session of International Court Opens Wed.

Court Was Created Under Terms of League of Nations Covenant.

The Hague, Feb. 14.—The International Court of Justice, created under the terms of the covenant of the League of Nations, held its first public session here tomorrow, with Chief Justice Loder presiding, and with a bench composed of a number of international jurists.

The scene of the opening ceremony will be in the great Hall of Justice in the Peace Palace, the imposing edifice which bears on its cornerstone the inscription:

"The generosity of Andrew Carnegie dedicated this house to the cause of peace, to be maintained by justice."

The great Hall of Justice is a singularly beautiful chapelle-like chamber, paneled in carved oak, with a seating capacity of 400, including the large rectangular gallery along one side.

The judges' bench is at the further end of the chamber, with a richly-carved oak table, surmounted by a green balustrade. Over this is hung an ornamental drape, embroidered in gold thread, showing in front the scales of justice.

The eleven judges and four deputy judges were elected from a list of 30 nominees, comprising thousands of delegates of the chamber, with a right of appeal to the League of Nations.

The statutes of the court consist of 64 articles prescribing that the members of the court be elected for nine years, being eligible for re-election, and prohibiting them from exercising any political or administrative function. When on court they enjoy diplomatic privileges and immunities. The president and vice-president of the court are to serve in these capacities for three years and they are eligible for re-election. Nine judges constitute a quorum. In order to speedily dispatch business the court shall form annually a chamber of three judges, who at the request of contesting parties may hear and determine cases by summary procedure.

## Don't Think You're Old And You'll Live To Be 100

Paris, Feb. 16.—"It is poisonous auto-suggestion entering the human mind which prevents mankind to day living 100 years or more," declares Jean Finot, noted psychologist and author. "The chief reason why men die before they reach 100 years of age is because for more than a century the public have been taught to believe that the normal span of life is not in excess of ninety; but if the next two generations are taught properly that this thesis is false, there will be a marked change in the vitality of the human race."

M. Finot also takes doctors to task, declaring that they are responsible largely for spreading a false idea of man's abilities, by refusing to give the usual treatment to numerous maladies that are ascribed to old age.
